## 10 Reasons to

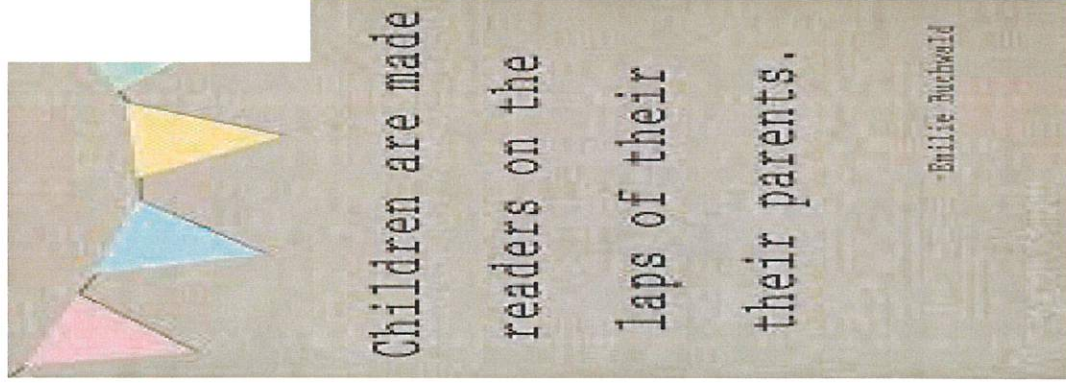
### Read to Your Child

Classroom Engagement: Students need to be on time, heads up and positively interact in class.

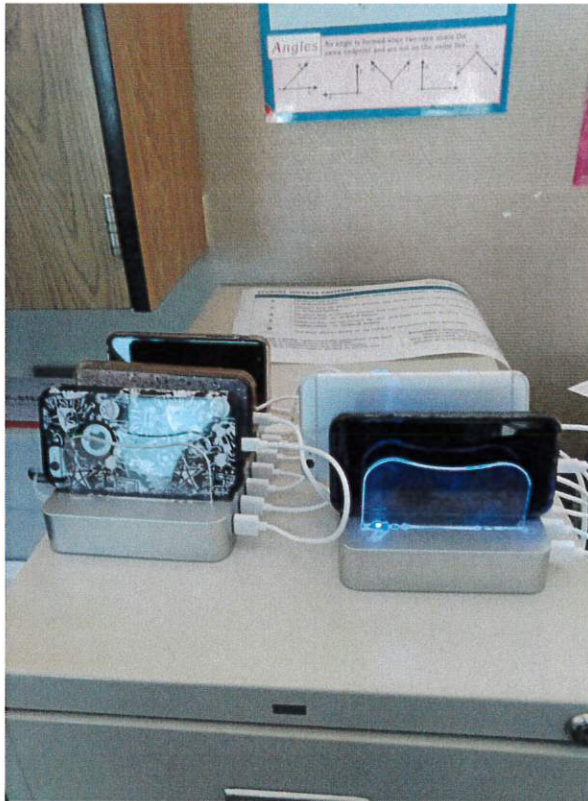
Language: No foul language allowed.
